<u>Shifts</u>

Early shift	07.30 until 15:30 (30min break)
Late shift	12:00 until 20:00 (30min break)
Long Day	07:30 until 20:00 (x2 30min breaks)
Night shift	19:30 until 08:00 (x2 30min breaks)

Please be aware there will be a make up shift as the hours above equate to 36 hours thus missing 1.5 hours a week, this can be factored into your student off duty by the PEL team when off duty is being allocated.

If for any reason you think you may not be able to attend any of your shifts its extremely important you contact the department as soon as possible to inform the Nurse in Charge (NIC). 01617782600

Meal breaks are allocated at start of shift via the break allocation board located near the main nurses station. Please inform co-ordinator when you are going on your break.

<u>Security</u>

At the back of each cubicle area there is an emergency alarm, pull the red alarm and help will arrive immediately, these alarms can be used for medical emergencies but also if there is a danger posed to yourself or another member of staff and you need assistance right away. DO NOT PUT YOUR SELF AT RISK! Always keep an escape point of exit.

Your property and valuables can be locked away in the locker of the nurse you are allocated to with their permission. As a reminder, only bring what you need for placement. Please note any expensive items brought into placement such as mobile phones, cash, laptops are your individual liability please only bring essential items for placement.





Clinical Areas of Practice

During your stay in Accident and Emergency you should get the opportunity to work in all areas of the department. See below a brief outline of topics that can be explored but to list a few, followed by a map of our Ed to help orientate yourself within this busy setting.

"Psssst, you could highlight some areas of practice you aim to learn from whilst on placement here in the Ed, this is your learning experience within an acute setting so please make the most of it!"

• Resuscitation (Resus)

Physiological/neurological observations,CPR, Diabetic crisis management, Red Flag Sepsis (RFS), Basic Life Support, uDNACPR (ethical considerations), Acute Illness Management, Airway assessments & Management, Breaking bad news (observing), Pressure Ulcer Management and Nursing interventions. N-STEMI, Manipulations of limbs, Major Trauma, Gastro-Intestinal Bleeds, Cerebrovascular Accidents CVA's (also known as strokes), Thrombolysis. ILS Assessment H+T'S (Reversible causes), discussion of ceiling of care (ward level, full escalation), End of Life care (EOL), Bereavement Support, ESCALATION.

• Majors Cubicles 1-17

Physiological/neurological observations, Falls management, Prevention of Falls, Nursing of the Mentally unwell, Dementia care, Diabetes care, Pressure Ulcer Management and Nursing interventions, Care of patient with abdominal pain, Care of a pregnant patient, Practice of communication skills (handover a patient under supervision) EOL care, Activities of Daily Living ADL's Assessments. Pain Management, Transient Ischaemic Attacks (TIA's), Central Chest Pain, Pleuritic Chest pain, Influenza, Corona Virus ESCALATION.

• Minors Cubicles/Paediatrics 1-5

Physiological/neurological observations, Nursing care for Children and Young People, Safeguarding Vulnerable Children, Referrals to Community Nursing, Alcohol Liaison for Young People, Head Injuries, Management of a Febrile Child. ESCALATION.





• Main Triage

Physiological/neurological observations, Rapid Assessments, Prioritisation Levels, Patient pathways (ACU/UTC/Wr), Decision making when at capacity, Risk Managment. Correct utilisation of resource, Patient Group Directive (Timely pain management) Keeping safe whilst lone working ESCALATION.

• Rapid Assessment & Triage, R.A.T

Physiological/neurological observations, Rapid Assessments, Prioritisation Levels, Patient pathways (ACU/UTC/Wr), Decision making when at capacity, Risk Managment. Correct utilisation of resource, Staff delegation, ESCALATION.

• Clinical Decisions Unit, CDU

Physiological/neurological observations, CT results, Discharge Planning, Communication skills (liaising with relatives), Safe transfers and discharges via ambulance (Take home, Tuck up service). Rapid Assessment and Discharge team. ESCALATION.


• Urgent Treatment Centre, UTC

Physiological/neurological observations, Minor Injuries, Head Injuries (HI), Rashes, Lacerations (LAC), ESCALATION.

Please arrive to Ed department wearing your own clothes bringing with you a fresh uniform to change into once you arrive for placement. (This is to reduce the spread of infection back into the community via unclean uniforms.

<u>Face mask Fit Testing</u>

Due to the increased risks associated with COVID-19 we have extensive infection control measures throughout the hospital but particularly in the Ed red zone areas where aerosol generating procedures (AGP's) occur frequently. Its essential you are fit tested pre placement to ensure the safety of you and others around you.
