On World Book Day and the eve of International Women's

Day, we are delighted to invite you to a 'Woman – book –
Sandwich' to celebrate 5 Hungarian plays translated into
English for the first time by Dr Szilvi Naray. This is 'more than
just a book launch' because excerpts will be performed
alongside a panel discussion and talk about the importance
of translation plays from central and Eastern Europe. The
audience can contribute their thoughts on the subjects
discussed and these will help influence the direction of future
research in this area.

Plays from Contemporary Hungary: 'Difficult Women' and Resistant Dramatic Voices (Bloomsbury, Methuen Drama) is a unique and well overdue collection of five translated contemporary plays (extracts will be performed) from the illebral democracy from Hungary offering a microcosmic lens for understanding the paradox that today's Hungary exemplifies. Together, the plays share stories of powerful women and explore what it means to be a family unit, all the while pushing against Hungary's dominant hegemony.




